Reading – Our whole school priority is reading and developing reading skills and questioning. Teachers are currently training in school to further develop ways to teach reading to overcome barriers to comprehension. Along-side this we would like to ask you to make time to hear your child read a minimum for 3 times each week. Regular reading practice is crucial

because progress in inference and comprehension relies on reading fluency. As a family you can significantly help your child by doing this.

Stanger danger – On Monday this week we were notified of an incident in Dronfield of an unknown person offering a child a lift. We wanted to make parents aware so that conversations about staying safe can happen outside of school as well as in school. An assembly took place on Tuesday this week with a general theme of staying safe.

Wintery weather - During the winter weather we do try our best to get the children outdoors for playtimes, our daily mile and PE; please ensure your child has at the very least a warm coat to wear each day. Children should enter school through the front door which will be open and a member of staff will be in the school hall to supervise. If the weather is very wet, children need to come across the playground and will be let in via the pupil entrance to keep dry.
